The Care Certificate

Course overview:

This course combined eLearning and Practical Skills Assessment course is designed for, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working or wishing to work in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their core skills and knowledge in caring for a client in the care industry.

Every individual new to health and social care, as well as those changing jobs within it, is required to undertake an induction programme that meets the Care Certificate standards and allows them to provide evidence of completed objectives.

Our Care Certificate course provides underpinning theory-based knowledge for the below 15 standards of Care Induction:

Moving and Positioning Training

Course overview:

This moving and positioning training course aims to help reduce the risk of injury to both the team members and the service users when performing people moving & handling techniques in the workplace.

Its aim is to ensure team members recognise the principles of safe moving and assisting and the importance of risk assessment prior to any moving and assisting task.

- Duties and Responsibilities of Employer and Employee
- Anatomy of Spine
- Risk Assessment using safe principles T.I.L.E.E.O

- Slings inserting whilst in bed/in a wheelchair

Basic Life Support Training

Course overview:

This training course aims to help teach team members a basic knowledge of first aid – covering CPR, recovery position, bleeding, choking and shock.

The course takes place over 3.5 hours and will teach the theoretical knowledge followed by the relevant practical "hands on" competency assessments to improve knowledge and skill.

Medication Administration Workshop

Course overview:

This training course covers the core information required around medications and how they should be treated, prescribed, dispensed and administered. It will cover the information required for team members to undertake their role in the safe handling of medication. Other key information such as the law and terminology is also included to ensure that team members have a fully rounded awareness of medication.

Positive and proactive, the training will empower delegates to develop individual PBS plans aimed at improving their clients' environment and wellbeing, thus decreasing the likelihood of disturbed behaviours.

Prevention & Management of Violence and Aggression (PMVA) Training

Course overview:

This two-day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their skills and knowledge in caring for a client expressing behaviours that challenge.

- Health and safety, human rights, criminal law, and how these runs alongside company policy and procedures
- De-escalation techniques including types of communication/body language
- Practical sessions including different types of restraint low and high impact
- Non-pain compliant methods of restraint and how to deal appropriately to different scenarios and the importance of teamwork
- Breakaway techniques
- The importance of clear robust de-briefing and report writing
- **Duration:** 2 days
- **CPD:** 13 hours

Ligature Rescue Training

Course overview:

This one-day course is specifically designed for support team members who are supporting individuals who are at risk of attempting suicide or self-harm by a number of means including the application of a ligature. Learners will gain practical skills and knowledge to recognise self-harm and ligature injuries, treat a casualty and also to safely remove someone from suspension. They will be able to recognise and identify possible ligature points and will be able to implement control measures in order to support individuals who are at risk from Ligature.

- We will explore ligature risk assessments and discuss environmental risk assessments.
- Review the organisation's current policy, process and procedures on the use of the cutters.
- Identify types of ligatures and ligature points.
- Recognise and describe the signs and symptoms of ligature injuries.
- Demonstrate the safe removal of ligatures using cutters.
- Demonstrate safe removal from suspension and incomplete suspension.
- Describe how to safely store, maintain, dispose and replace cutters.
- Explore anti ligature devices
- Explore ligature risk assessments and environmental risk assessments.
- Discuss First Aid actions following strangulation or attempted strangulation.

Specialist Clinical Skills Training Offer

Adult & Paediatric Tracheostomy Awareness Training

Course overview:

This one-day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers, and healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in complex care and who have limited tracheostomy experience.

Learn about caring for clients with a tracheostomy in the community and gain practical experience in simulated practice learning, which replicate situations in tracheostomy care you are likely to encounter in practice. The aim is to improve care, enhance patient safety and optimise outcomes in a safe and controlled environment. All aspects of training include guidelines from the National Tracheostomy Safety Project (UK).

- Overview of Anatomy & physiology of the respiratory system
- Awareness of Indications for a tracheostomy
- Understanding of types and characteristics of adult tracheostomy including, tracoe twist tubes, fenestrated/infenestrated, cuffed/uncuffed, & subglottic tracheostomies. Paediatric tubes including neonatal and paediatric Shiley tubes and Bivona flextend
- Caring for a client with a tracheostomy including:
 - Awareness of safe suction technique
 - Awareness of tracheostomy tape/tie changes.
 - o Awareness of rationale for humidification and nebulization
 - Awareness of speaking valves
 - Awareness of routine tracheostomy tube changes
 - Awareness of tracheostomy emergencies including what to do if a tracheostomy becomes blocked or displaced
- Simulated practice stations including, suction, tape/tie changes, tracheostomy tube change and emergency one person technique tracheostomy tube change

Ventilation Awareness

Course overview:

This half day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers and healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in complex care who have limited ventilation experience.

Learn about caring for clients on a ventilator and gain practical experience in simulated practice learning which replicate situations in ventilatory care you are likely to encounter in the community. The aim is to improve care, enhance patient safety and optimise outcomes in a safe controlled environment.

- To understand rationale for ventilation
- Ventilation at home and indications for treatment
- Overview on sleep and ventilation
- Overview of invasive and non-invasive ventilation
- Overview of modes of ventilation including CPAP and BiPAP
- Care of a client on a ventilator in the community including safety checks at the beginning of the shift.
- Overview of common ventilators and controls in the community
- Troubleshooting ventilator alarms
- Setting up wet and dry circuits
- **Duration:** 1/2 day
- **CPD:** 3.5 hours

Cough Assist Training

Course overview:

This half-day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in complex care who have limited cough assist machine experience.

Learn about caring for clients who require the use of a cough assist machine to keep them safe in the community. The aim is to improve care, enhance patient safety and optimise outcomes in a safe controlled environment.

- Understand why we need to assist clients to cough
- Contra-indications of cough assist
- Checks prior to use of cough assist
- Cleaning and maintenance
- Understand safety precautions

Enteral Feeding Training

Course overview:

This half day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in caring for a client with a gastrostomy/jejunostomy.

Learn about caring for clients requiring enteral feeding in the community and gain practical experience in simulated practice learning which replicate situations in peg care you are likely to encounter. The aim is to improve care, enhance patient safety and optimise outcomes in a safe controlled environment.

- Anatomy of the gastrointestinal system
- Overview of gastrostomies including low profile feeding devices and PEG tubes
- Understand indications for gastrostomy
- Care of the client and your responsibilities with a gastrostomy & jejunostomy
- Stoma care and infection control
- Complications of a PEG
- Feeding via a gastrostomy tube, including bolus, intermittent gravity and continuous pump feeds
- Overview of medication administration via G-Tube
- Demonstration in simulated practice setting up feed extension tube for low profile feeding tubes
- Setting up a feed in simulated practice
- **Duration:** 1/2 day
- CPD: 3.5 hours
- Maximum number of delegates: 12



Epilepsy Awareness with Rescue Medication Administration

Course overview:

This half day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in caring for a client with epilepsy.

The course will provide an awareness of epilepsy covering the various types of epilepsy and seizures, the causes and triggers of a seizure and will also explain what to do in the event of a seizure.

It will cover the administration of rescue medication, Buccal Midazolam (and Rectal Diazepam if required) and provide participants an opportunity to practice scenario's to gain confidence in using these medications during a seizure.

- Overview of epilepsy and how to recognize seizure activity
- Overview of how epilepsy is diagnosed and treated
- Overview of epilepsy triggers
- Overview of anti-epilepsy medications and treatments including, vagal-nerve stimulation, & keto-genic diet
- Have an understanding of SUDEP
- Have an understanding of what to do in an emergency
- Have an understanding of status epilepticus
- Have an understanding of the types of emergency treatments including administration of buccal midazolam and rectal paraldehyde (in children)
- **Duration:** 1/2 day
- **CPD:** 3.5 hours
- Maximum number of delegates: 12

Spinal Injury & Brain Injury Awareness

Course overview:

This one-day course is designed for registered nurses, community carers, support workers & healthcare assistants working in the healthcare industry who are looking to enhance their clinical skills and knowledge in caring for a client with spinal injury and brain injury.

This course will help delegates understand the causes and consequences of spinal injury and the care to prevent Autonomic Dysreflexia. It will cover the awareness course material as well as further knowledge about nutrition, respiratory care and the support networks to help client to adjust to life with a spinal or brain injury.

- Anatomy of the spine & central nervous system (CNS)
- What is Autonomic Dysreflexia
- Advantages/disadvantages of urinary catheters
- Importance of effective infection control
- How to handle, empty and change catheter bag
- Awareness of fluid balance

- Privacy, dignity and respect
- Suppositories, manual evacuation & enemas

Brain Injury:

- Define brain injury & brain facts
- How does the brain work
- Severities of the injuries
- Brain injury symptoms
- Recovery
- Strategies for living with a brain injury

- **CPD:** 3.5 hours
- Maximum number of delegates: 12



Diabetes Awareness Training

Course overview:

This course aims to improve delegates' knowledge and understanding of diabetes. It is recommended for any care and nursing teams working with clients and patients with diabetes.

The course will give a clear understanding of how to identify the signs of a diabetic attack and will teach best practise in dealing with an emergency, including insulin administration.
